TERM 3 CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

ENGLISH

This term, our Year 1 students will become junior weather reporters as they explore the exciting world of sunshine, wind, rain and storms. Through reading, writing, listening and speaking activities, they will investigate real weather reports, build weather vocabulary, and create simple, informative texts.

The unit culminates with students stepping in front of a green screen to present their own weather report. Using clear speech, expressive language and engaging visuals, they'll report on a weather event just like a real meteorologist.



SCIENCE

This term, our Year 1 students will become curious scientists as they investigate the changing world around them. Through observations and simple investigations, they will explore how the sky, weather and their local environment change across the day, weeks and seasons.

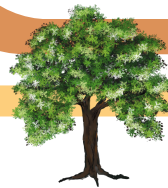
Students will record their observations using drawings, photographs and discussions, developing their scientific thinking as they discover patterns and changes in the world around them.

MATHEMATICS

1 2 3

This term, our Year 1 students will become junior meteorologists as they explore the world of weather through hands-on maths investigations. Students will build confidence with numbers by modelling, adding and subtracting, sharing and grouping, while solving real-world weather challenges.

They will also explore 2D shapes and 3D objects by identifying, sorting and creating weather-themed designs. Through games, problem-solving and creative activities, students will discover how maths helps us make sense of the world around us-rain or shine!



HASS

This term, our Year 1 students will explore the many ways families are unique and connected. They will learn about different family structures, create simple family trees, and discover how families celebrate important events and traditions.

Students will also investigate how family stories are shared across generations through photographs, artefacts, books and conversations.

DRAMA

Students are learning about improvisation and dramatic play through songs and actions about Weather. They are looking at how they can portray different types of Weather.

MUSIC

Students will travel the world through music, exploring instruments, dances and traditions from different cultures. Along the way, they will develop their singing, keyboard, ukulele and percussion skills before composing and performing their own music in small groups.



HPE

Students will develop fundamental athletics skills, including sprinting, long jump, throwing and ball games, while building balance, coordination, strength and confidence. They will also explore friendship, inclusion and belonging by identifying the qualities of a good friend.
