TERM 3 CURRICULUM OVERVIEW



ENGLISH

This term, our Year 2 students will become text detectives and creative authors as they explore imaginative stories from around the world.

They will investigate how authors use characters, settings and events to create meaning before reimagining a familiar tale by placing it in a new cultural setting.

As they read, write and create, students will build their reading fluency, expand their vocabulary, strengthen spelling and punctuation skills, and celebrate the diverse cultures represented in our classroom through storytelling.



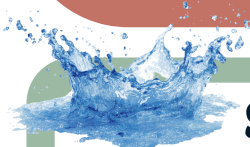
MATHEMATICS



This term, our Year 2 students will become party planners as they solve real-world maths challenges using addition, subtraction, multiplication and money.

They will also measure and compare length, mass and capacity using informal units while explaining their thinking and problem-solving strategies.

The unit culminates in a Party Planning Maths Challenge, where students apply their mathematical skills to organise a successful class celebration.



SCIENCE

Students will investigate one of Earth's most precious resources - water.

Through hands-on investigations, they will explore where water comes from, how it moves through the environment, how it is used in everyday life, and why it is important to use it responsibly.

Students will develop an appreciation for water as a valuable natural resource while discovering practical ways to conserve it at school and beyond.



HASS

Students will explore what makes a place special by investigating significant local sites and why they should be preserved. They will build mapping skills using maps and globes to locate Australia, continents and oceans.

Students will also research a local community issue, present their findings in a multimedia presentation, and reflect on ways they can make a positive difference in their community.

DRAMA

The term, students are learning to create roles and situations to share cultures and communities' stories from Around the World while learning the elements of drama.

MUSIC

Students will travel the world through music, exploring instruments, dances and traditions from different cultures. Along the way, they will develop their singing, keyboard, ukulele and percussion skills before composing and performing their own music in small groups.



HPE

Students will develop fundamental athletics skills, including sprinting, long jump, throwing and ball games, while building balance, coordination, strength and confidence. They will also explore friendship, inclusion and belonging by identifying the qualities of a good friend.
